Open Floor Discussion – anything on mind to get things going

- Would like to see the Labrador grow ... would like to see Labrador hardness, need to feel what’s best for this campus ... “head and the heart” needs to understand Labrador
- Would love to see a connection with the north, not just an interest ... someone that knows the mining and agriculture sectors for especially up north
 - Have an understanding of funding sources for this campus
 - Wants an understanding of community engagement pieces
 - Doesn’t need to necessarily be a Labradorean
- Local capacity building is critical – looking at farming, how do we do things more local and more sustainable
 - Would like to see public engagement from Labrador – it’s a small team here that does so much here within this group
 - Would like to see a university presidential that likes to chat on a local basis --- that looks at capacity building
 - Not just St. John’s centric
- Indigenization of the north
 - Felt the indigenization piece hard when it all shaped out with the last MUN president
 - Felt on a very personal level for a large number of people that worked within the Labrador campus
 - Need strong leadership
- Small but growing campus – would love to see this continue to grow, would love to see more education on the training that is needed ... le like Social Work, more support to mental health and addictions ... this could really help the people here
- Has an understanding of Indigenous issues – good relationship building skills
- Ability to speak with compassion, truth, and strength --- not just hiding behind words
 - Able to have tough conversations
 - Be transparent
- High degree of cultural awareness of Newfoundland and Labrador --- don’t need to be from here, but need to understand
 - A high degree of humility – an understanding they’re there to learn and acknowledge what they don’t know
 - Needs someone who is brave

- Universities need to be a place you voice your thoughts – but you need to come to a resolution quickly and move on from this item
- Labrador campus has its own constitution --- hopes that it gets read, it's important to our identity
- Wants a president that doesn't need to read the land acknowledge but knows it off the top of their head ... should be engrained, it then shows meaning
- EDI is significant – wants a president that addresses this publicly --- which will sometimes mean saying things the public may not be happy on
 - Brave again --- learn to take criticism
 - If university is serious on Labrador – you would have to take from Grenfell and St. John's
- Many folks want to come here – but housing is a challenge, lack of availability and its costs tied to them as well
- Need additional space for lab storage
- Communication needs in Labrador – Andrew Mercer question
 - Would love just basic advertising in Labrador that “we're here” --- general people don't have an understanding we're even here
- We've lost students due to lack of residences --- have some rental units, but it's not sufficient --- and it's not growing MUN but growing a landlord
 - Feel like money is spent on the bigger campuses with the bigger name
- Duty to the people of Labrador – being more aware of the people and opportunities here
 - Lot of missed opportunities on engagement with the Indigenous groups here
- Budget is created each year – [REDACTED]

- The role of the President should not be to make everyone happy
 - Administration shouldn't be responsible for making everyone happy --- this is part of the bravery piece previously brought up
- Should the next President be from NL?
 - As long as they have the understanding of the different cultures within the province and that all campuses are important ... not always St. John's centric
- Need someone that can manage a multi site giant – MUN is so geographically spread out – province is also gigantic too
 - Need to ensure all campuses feel value
 - Needs a welcome face to the university – needs to act in the best of the university while also navigating government relations
- How often should the MUN President come up to Labrador
 - At least once a quarter ... but more if the need arises
 - Depends on further positions being added to the Labrador campus – especially if our “Head” is hired to Labrador
 - All visits up are well respected when the university president travels up here
- Open v Closed search
 - Can't be closed – but can't be fully open either, as this would be difficult ... likely would get less applicants with this way

- Important for the communities to have access to the information – why were certain applicants successful
