[REDACTED] The title of the email references a slogan of the terrorist group Hamas, calling for the eradication of the state of Israel and the Israeli people – being genocide, the second against the Jewish people in less than a century.

However, the Student Union makes claims of "genocide" comparing the Israeli response to October 7th Hamas attack on Israeli civilians to the South African apartheid and the Rwandan genocide of the Tutsi. This is an historically inaccurate comparison. The political motivation of these protest organizers is a genocide of Israelis. This should not be allowed in a publicly funded university. In the email the Student Union refers to "Israeli students", as code for Canadian Jewish students, whom they target by proxy. There is no place for this type of hate. It is not "free speech" to chant for the eradication of a sovereign state, and its people, or for violence against those of the same ethnic, or religious, background. The university and its student union should not be promoting antisemitism on campus, nor allow some students to avail of an encampment on campus.

I am astounded that the Student Union is making demands in regards to the university's investments of the endowment and pension funds. As your update stated, these funds are not derived from tuition. I took the time to review the *Endowment Report* confirming a standard, conservative investment of 30% in Global equity index funds, which is perfectly reasonable. Students, even the Student Union, cannot be permitted to guide the investment strategy of the endowment and pension funds. They are not contributors, moreover, they lack the knowledge and objectivity to be the stewards of these investments.

Furthermore, [REDACTED] Upon closer review, I note that the Student Union "Constituency Representatives" number 9 "woke" reps, when the actual academic faculties only have 17 representatives. Is half of the business of the Student Union advocacy for minority groups, rather than the academic interests of all students on campus, the numbers suggest so.

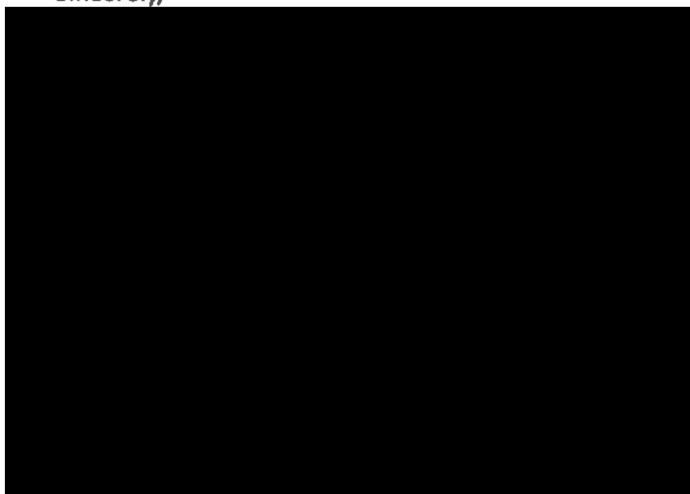
As the Student Union wishes to take partisan and antisemitic political positions, making demands on the administration as to how it invests its endowment and pension, they should be able to grasp that students and parents may also demand that mandatory student union fees are NOT used to fund Pro-Hamas protests. The Student Union fees should be optional, to allow students and parents to boycott all students who are complicit with the terrorist group Hamas' rape, torture, killing and hostage taking of Israeli civilians, not to mention Hamas' embezzlement of UN funds for Palestinian civilians to fund its terror.

Lastly, it is an invasion of privacy for the Student Union to misuse student email addresses for mass emailing for a radical political group. This is an abuse of the student's email account for which students pay fees to use for academic purposes. This student union should be sanctioned for the misuse of student email addresses and personal information as well as its political partisanship and gross overreach into matters of the endowment and pension investments.

Please do consider making the Student Union fees optional, this will show the Student Union what "divestment" means and allow students and parents to pay for what they deem of value, such as the basic necessities of life and a quality post-secondary education. I suggest that for the upcoming academic year, students must "opt in" to the Student Union fees after reading and initialing the Student Union expense and activity disclosure and that each individual student may designate the amount they wish to pay in Student Union fees.

I commend you on your handling of this situation: graciously giving this vocal minority your ear, but also by being firm and fair in your response. Thank you for your leadership.

As I'm sure you are aware, the severity of the situation in Gaza continues to worsen. After over 18 weeks of bombardment by the Israeli military, over 1.4 million Palestinians have been forced to flee to Rafah. Within the last four months, hospitals, ambulances, and refugee camps have been targeted by the Israeli invasion, killing over 28,000 Gazans - thousands of them children. Since February 11, the targeting of civilians has intensified in Rafah, the one place they were instructed to head towards and were told was safe. This is an unspeakable crime against humanity and will go down in history books as an apartheid and a genocide.

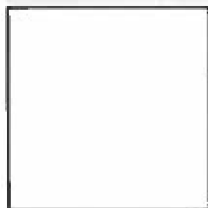

I can speak to your last point about communication with BoR. I have just forwarded you the email that was sent to tinas@mun.ca, vcollins@mun.ca, rhymed.evans@mun.ca, sahmedali@mun.ca, joanb@mun.ca on May 28 at 11:14 am. As well as another sent to tinas@mun.ca that same evening at 7:31pm.

I understand in a position like yours, you would be very busy- but [REDACTED] I would appreciate it if you could take some time out of your day to read this. I have been keeping up with the Encampment from Palestine, Yazan's Yard, and most recently read through the documents sent by the Dean of Humanities.

I am quite confused as to some of the points you made in the 'meeting minutes'. I know throughout the past few months you have stated that MUN will not be taking any sides. However, according to the minute meetings, you said, "We won't be signing anything which advocates for one particular aspect", and furthermore "So we can't support one set of viewpoints over another because we have multiple viewpoints across our campus and we have to support all of our students". Correct me if I am wrong, but the students are asking MUN to disclose exactly where funding goes and divest from any investment that benefits Israel. Specifically, divesting from the weapon's manufacturers. How would divesting from a weapon manufacturer, regardless of where they are and what they are doing, affect the students at MUN? Would it affect their well-being, physically or mentally? Would it make them feel unsafe to know that the university chose to stop funding an arms manufacturer or any kind?

Students are not asking you to release a political statement saying that the MUN administration condemns Israel and stands with Palestine- I understand that this would be a tricky public relations situation, and could,

hypothetically, make an Israeli student feel unsafe. Students are, however, asking that you divest from Israeli weapon manufacturers, and not do things like sending out emails promoting scholarships that have study options in Israel- when they are actively causing a mass atrocity against Palestinians, as was sent on March 21st and March 22nd. **Once again, I believe that divesting from any weapon manufacturer, regardless of who they are, would have zero effect on the students at MUN. If you think otherwise, could you please explain?** I truly am trying to understand the logic of the administration [REDACTED] and I am finding it nearly impossible at this moment in time.

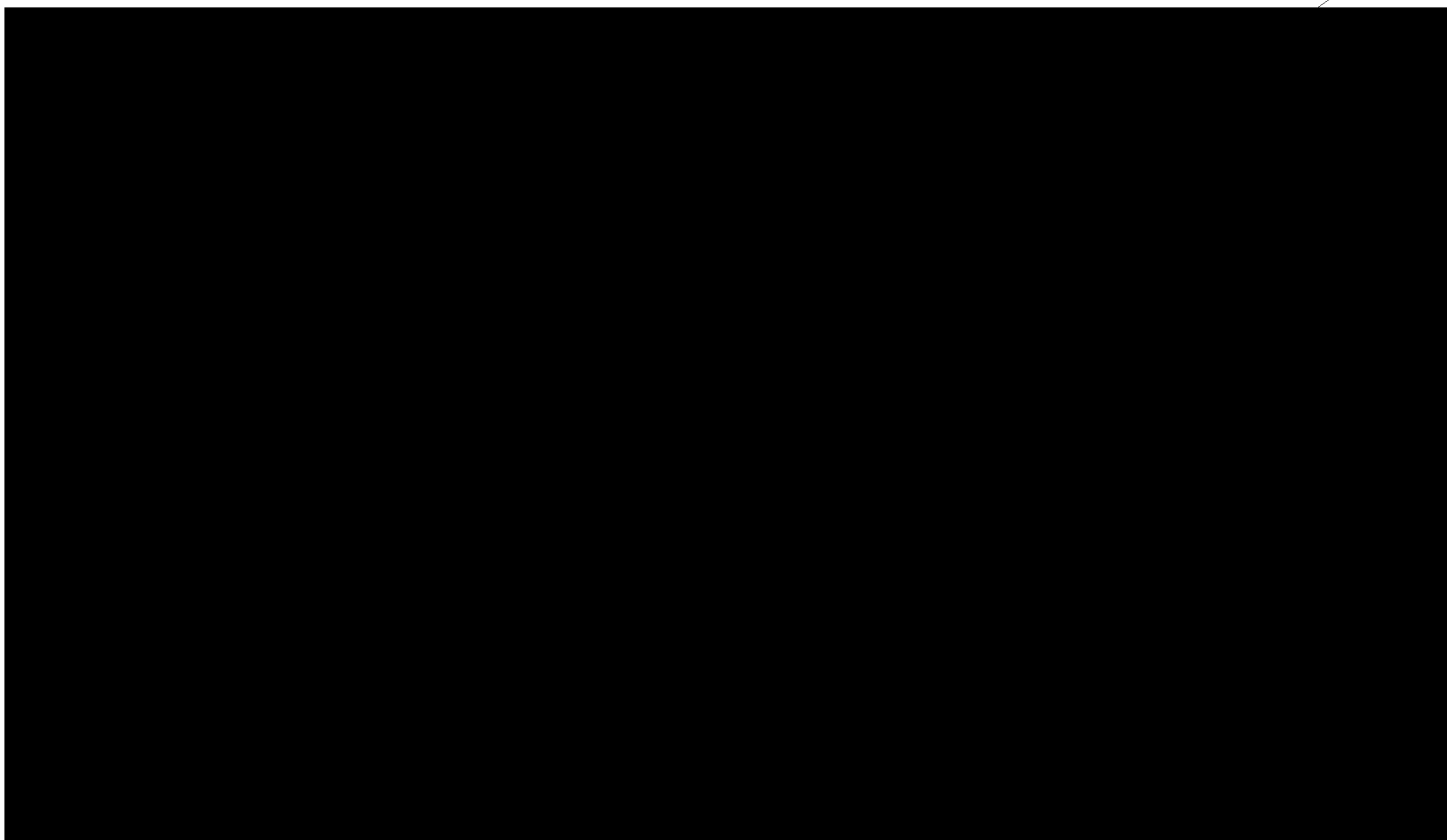

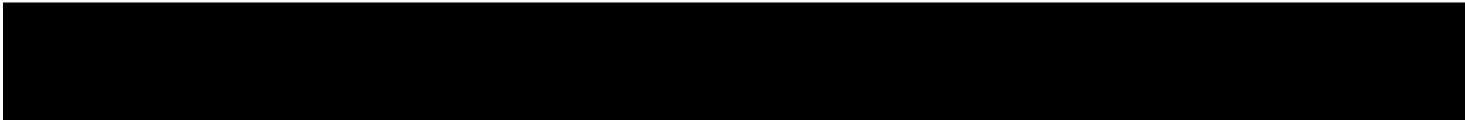
