Dear Dr. Neil Bose,

Memorial Administration's decision on Friday July 5 to send armed police to remove peaceful protesters was a disgusting act of violence towards its students, and a gross misuse of resources.

We find the excuses offered illegitimate and unacceptable.

-VP Jennifer Lokash cited "a legal obligation to act on orders of a recent fire inspection report". However the report was withheld from students who sought it out on Friday afternoon. When students finally received the report on July 10 the compliance date was revealed to be July 11, 6 days after the police were called.

- Administration claims students had ample warning about the removal yet no date or time was ever indicated. Communications with all relevant offices that day suggested discussions would continue on Monday and even the universities designated student safety liaison admitted he was unaware students would be removed on Friday night until after it had begun.

3 minutes from the time the trespass notice was first read, police were present.

- MUN claims it cares about safety while shutting its Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Anti-racism lead out of conversations before calling in armed police on a group of peaceful protesters including racialized students.

And after all this there has been no proper debriefing with key people involved. As of Wednesday night campus enforcement who had been present on Friday had not been debriefed despite students advocating for this through the union and the liaison for student safety had been provided an inaccurate account of events missing such key information as the fact that students had been arrested and physically removed.

This is unacceptable.

We question the role that student's exposure of potential conflicts of interest and breaches of confidentiality involving the Chair of the Board of Regents played in this decision, and we demand accountability for those involved.

Each of your names will be remembered for the choices you make now.

Will you stand up to this corruption and seek the truth?

Will you stand up for humanity and speak out against the genocide unfolding in Palestine?

Will you stand on the right side of history, right the wrongs of MUNs previous stance on apartheid South Africa, and divest now?

Memorial Administration's decision to send armed police to remove peaceful protesters was a disgusting act of violence towards its students, and a gross misuse of resources.

We question the role that the exposure of potential conflicts of interest and breaches of confidentiality by the Chair of the Board of Regents played in this decision, and we demand accountability for who within the university who made this choice, and why.

Since this escalation on behalf of the Admin, we find the excuses they've presented so far to be illegitimate.

- When talking to VOCCM and CBC, Jennifer Lokash said that "the university had a legal obligation to act on orders of a recent fire inspection report." However, despite repeated attempts on Friday, MUN Students 4 Palestine never received access to this report. After contacting the St. John's Regional Fire Department, students were able to see that the deadline for compliance by the University was July 11th. Therefore, the University did NOT have a legal obligation to

**Subject: Direction from Board of Regents on recent protest activity**

At its meeting on July 11, 2024, Memorial's Board of Regents had a discussion about the university's response to the demands presented by the MUN Students 4 Palestine group. The discussion was focused on two issues: divestment and the joint statement.

The board has provided direction on two issues.

#### **Divestment**

The university will not divest of any university investments and it will endorse the commitments to enhanced transparency, responsible investing and support for students and scholars displaced by war, made by the university administration and shared publicly.

The board's divestment decision was made in consideration of the board's legal responsibility as a fiduciary for the pension plan and for university investments.

#### **Joint Statement**

The Board of Regents supports a joint statement with Memorial University student unions that affirms our support for peace, freedom of expression and academic freedom, and denounces violence and acts of terror that have led to profound suffering around the world.

Since the board has made it clear that any joint statement must be developed with and endorsed by Memorial's four student unions, we have asked the protest group to work with the leaders of our student unions to develop a process for moving forward with collaboration on a statement.

Since the protests began more than 50 days ago, various university leaders and board members have met with protestors multiple times. We have worked to address these concerns and we hope that protesters can recognize the changes that have resulted from their efforts.

The university has publicly disclosed its investments. We have made changes to enhance our commitment to responsible investment and support for students displaced by war.

From the beginning, our focus has been on the health and safety of the university community. This includes our responsibility to respond to the multiple concerns raised by other members of the Memorial community.

We recognize this has been a difficult time for many at Memorial. Memorial condemns the violence and acts of terror that have led to profound suffering for Palestinian and Israeli people. We acknowledge the members of our community who are in deep pain and join them in calling for the end to all violence against civilians. The targeted attacks on educational institutions in Gaza represent an assault on the very essence of education and academic freedom. We realize the impacts this has not just in that region but across communities and the broader academic landscape.

The university will continue its work towards improved transparency, responsible investing and increased supports for students impacted by war.

At its meeting on July 11, 2024, Memorial's Board of Regents ██████ discussion about the university's response to the demands presented by the MUN Students 4 Palestine. The discussion was focused on two issues: divestment and the joint statement.

The Board has provided direction on two issues:

**Divestment**

The University will not divest of any University investments and it will endorse the commitments to enhanced transparency, responsible investing and support for students and scholars displaced by war, made by the University Administration and shared publicly.

The Board's divestment decision was made in consideration of the Board's ██████ as a fiduciary for the pension plan and for university investments.

**Joint Statement**

The Board supports a joint statement with Memorial University student unions that affirms our support for peace, freedom of expression and academic freedom, and denounces violence and acts of terror that have led to profound suffering around the world.

Since the Board has made it clear that any joint statement must be developed with and endorsed by Memorial's four student unions, we have asked the protest group to work with the leaders of our student unions to develop a process for moving forward with collaboration on a statement.

Since the protests began more than 50 days ago, various university leaders and board members have met with protestors multiple times. We have worked to address these concerns and we hope that protesters can recognize the changes that have resulted from their efforts.

The university has disclosed its investments. We have made changes to enhance our commitment to responsible investment and support for students displaced by war.

From the beginning, our focus has been on the health and safety of the university community. This includes our responsibility to respond to the multiple concerns raised by other members of the Memorial community.

We recognize this has been a difficult time for many at Memorial. Memorial condemns the violence and acts of terror that have led to profound suffering for Palestinian and Israeli people. We acknowledge the members of our community who are in deep pain and join them in calling for the end to all violence against civilians. The targeted attacks on educational institutions in Gaza represent an assault on the very essence of education and academic freedom. We realize the impacts this has not just in that region but across communities and the broader academic landscape. The university will continue its work towards improved transparency, responsible investing and increased supports for students impacted by war.

Thank you for taking the time to share your concerns with us. [REDACTED] s. 40 (1)

We agree that universities are a place for learning, debate and protest. As a university, we strongly support the right to peaceful protest and believe in the importance of allowing our students to express their views. We also have a responsibility to ensure the safety and security of all members of our community. The occupation of the Arts and Administration building created safety and operational challenges that we were obliged to address. We told the protesters on July 4, via their legal counsel and in a public statement, that they could not continue to live in a building or camp on grounds that are meant for work and study.

Our hope was that after sharing that position, along with our commitments to transparency, responsible investing and student supports, protesters would recognize the success they have achieved and agree to end the occupation and the encampment—and continue protesting in alternate ways — while we continued to work together.

On July 5, when the building was set to close at the end of the day, the students were advised by CEP that the building was closing and they should leave. Most of them did. Three protesters refused to leave. CEP informed them that they couldn't stay and also explained the next steps if they chose not to leave: that RNC would come in to talk to them and provide context and options. That is what happened. We understand and respect your perspective on the presence of police on campus. The decision to involve law enforcement was not taken lightly.

At no point has Memorial discouraged nor tried to stop peaceful protesting. Not being allowed to continuously occupy a university building in no way diminishes the students' right to peaceful and lawful protest. We will continue to work with student protesters to address their concerns and are meeting with them later this week to continue that process.

Once again, thank you for reaching out and for your honest feedback. We hope to rebuild your trust and continue to work towards a university that reflects the values we all hold dear.

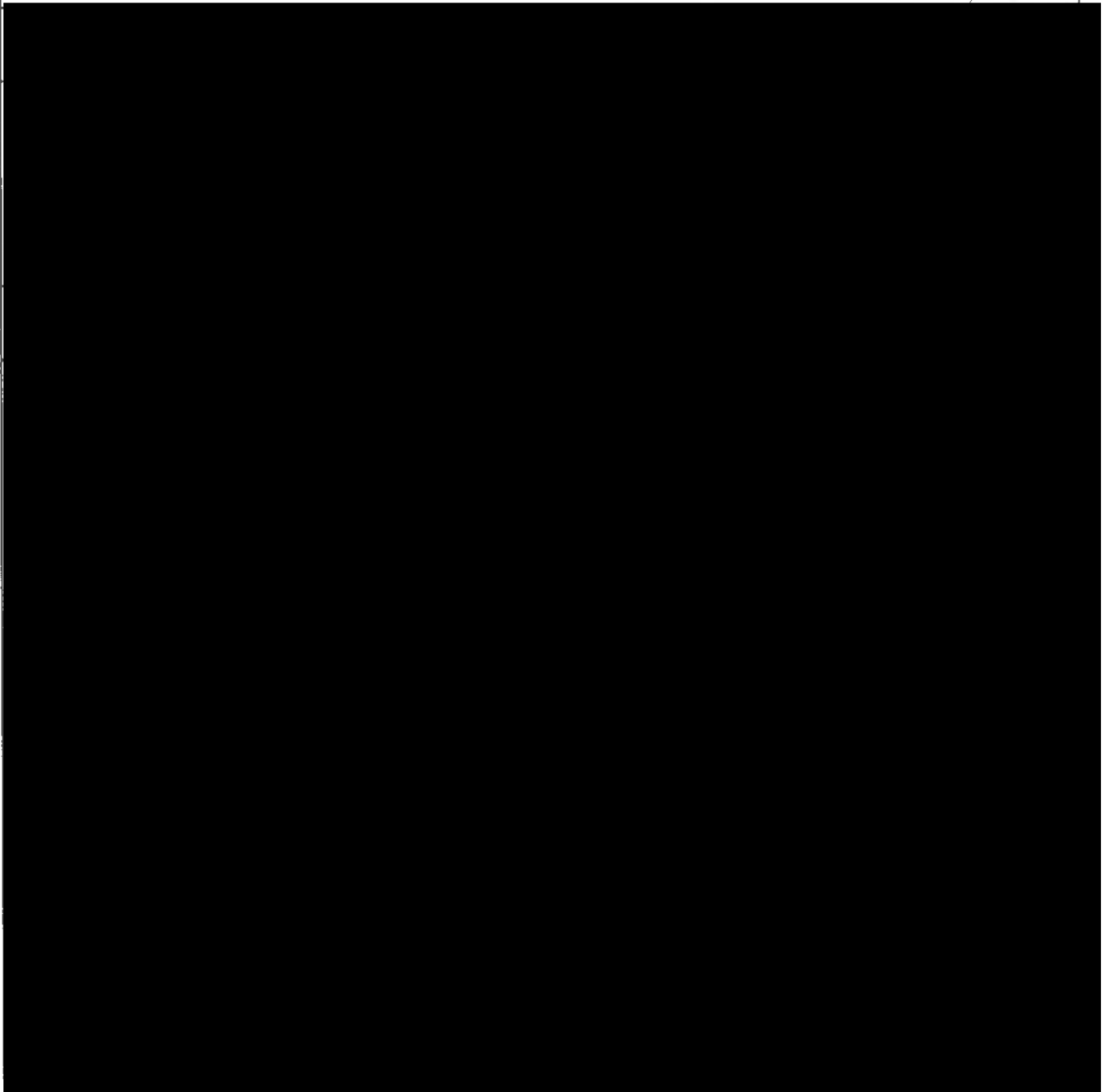

Dear Dr. Neil Bose,

Memorial Administration's decision on Friday July 5 to send armed police to remove peaceful protesters was a disgusting act of violence towards its students, and a gross misuse of resources.

We find the excuses offered illegitimate and unacceptable.

-VP Jennifer Lokash cited "a legal obligation to act on orders of a recent fire inspection report". However the report was withheld from students who sought it out on Friday afternoon. When students finally received the report on July 10 the compliance date was revealed to be July 11, 6 days after the police were called.

- Administration claims students had ample warning about the removal yet no date or time was ever indicated. Communications with all relevant offices that day suggested discussions would continue on Monday and even the universities designated student safety liaison admitted he was unaware students would be removed on Friday night until after it had begun.

3 minutes from the time the trespass notice was first read, police were present.

- MUN claims it cares about safety while shutting its Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Anti-racism lead out of conversations before calling in armed police on a group of peaceful protesters including racialized students.

And after all this there has been no proper debriefing with key people involved. As of Wednesday night campus enforcement who had been present on Friday had not been debriefed despite students advocating for this through the union and the liaison for student safety had been provided an inaccurate account of events missing such key information as the fact that students had been arrested and physically removed.

This is unacceptable.

We question the role that student's exposure of potential conflicts of interest and breaches of confidentiality involving the Chair of the Board of Regents played in this decision, and we demand accountability for those involved.

Each of your names will be remembered for the choices you make now.

Will you stand up to this corruption and seek the truth?

Will you stand up for humanity and speak out against the genocide unfolding in Palestine?

Will you stand on the right side of history, right the wrongs of MUNS previous stance on apartheid South Africa, and divest now?

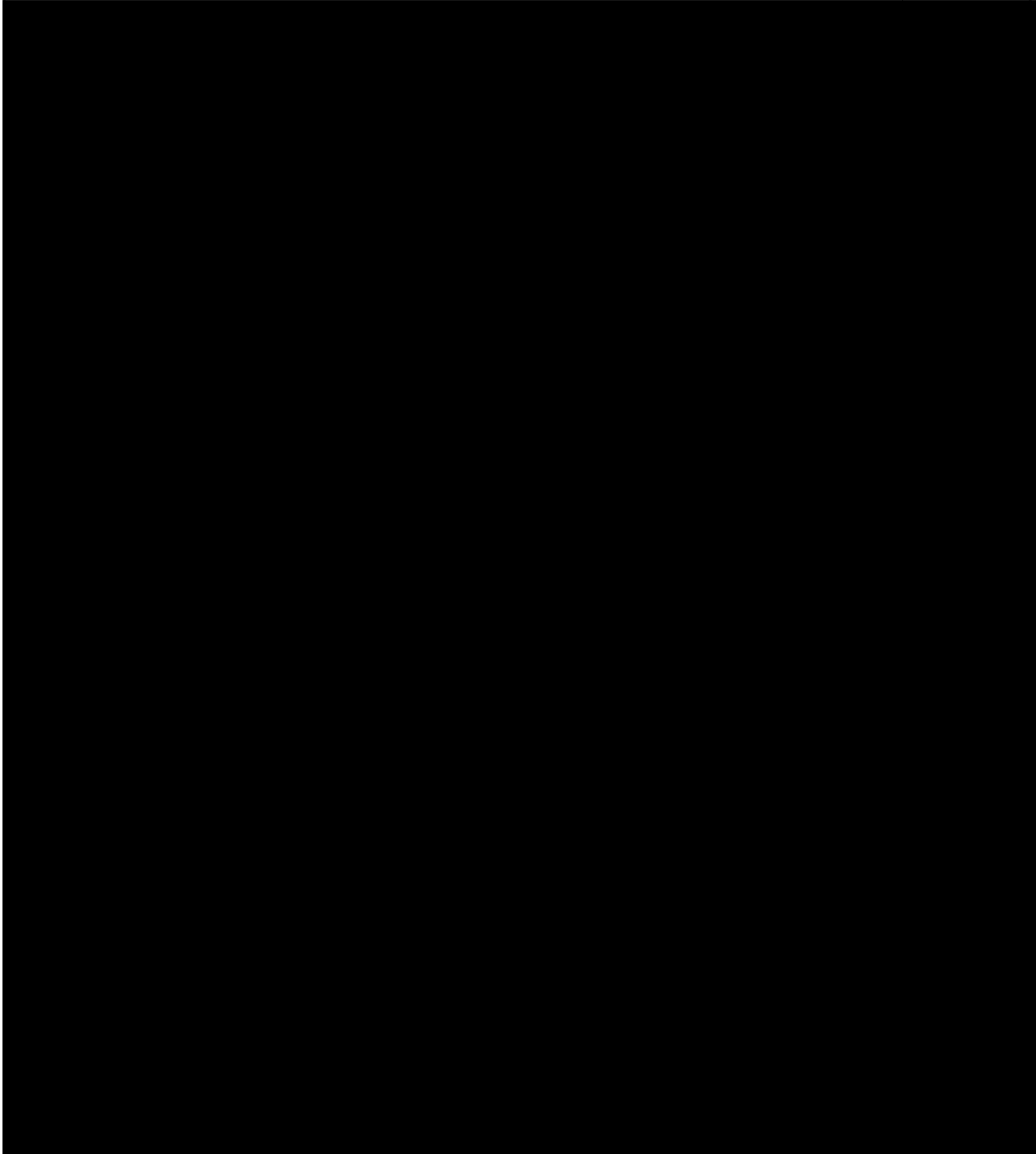



### International study permits granted by IRCC outpaces number from same period last year

The *Vancouver Sun* reports that the number of international study permits granted by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) in 2024 has outpaced the number of permits granted over the same period in 2023 (216,260 vs 200,205). During the first five months of 2024, the greatest number of student visas were granted to students from India, China, Nigeria, the Philippines, and Nepal. Each of these countries saw a greater number of visa permits granted than in the same period last year. IRCC spokesperson Rémi Larivière said that it may be too early to assess how the intake cap has impacted study permit applications, as summer and early fall are the busiest season for study permit processing.

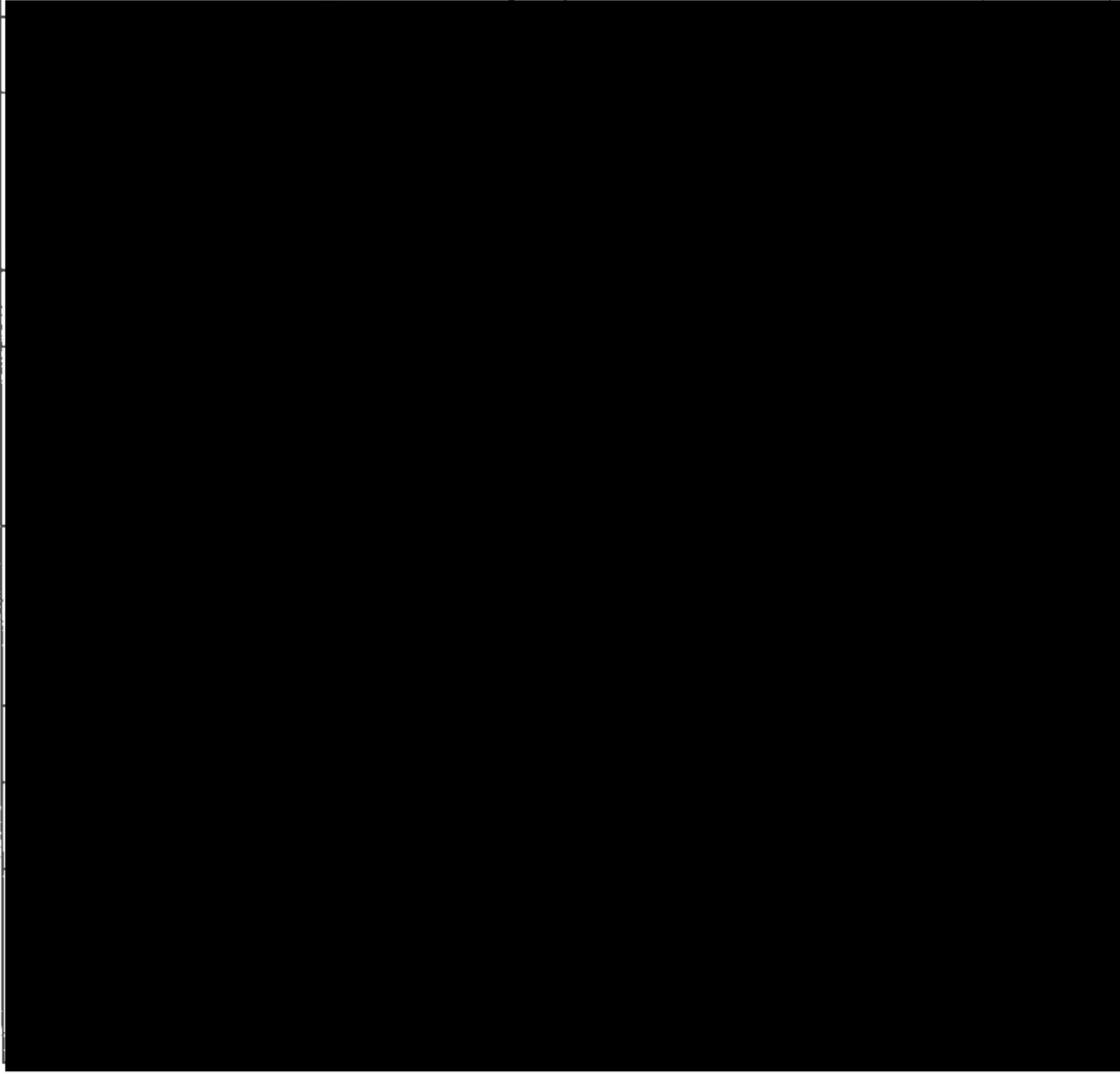

Thank you for your letter of July 23, 2024.

At Memorial University, we strongly support the right to peaceful protest and believe in the importance of allowing our students to express their views. However, peaceful protest does not include allowing a group of people to live in a university building that is not meant for that purpose.

The protestors' occupation of the Arts and Administration building created safety and operational challenges, and raised multiple concerns from other members of the Memorial community, that we were obliged to address. This was communicated on Thursday, July 4, to the legal counsel representing the protestors, reiterated publicly on Friday, July 5 and shared directly with those protestors occupying the Arts and Administration building that Friday evening.

On July 5, when the Arts and Administration building was set to close, Campus Enforcement and Patrol (CEP) officers reminded student protesters of the university's position and the expectation that they vacate the building at closing time.

Following this reminder, a number of protesters chose to leave the building. Three protesters did not, and the Royal Newfoundland Constabulary (RNC) responded to assist. Over the course of approximately 90 minutes, students were informed, by both CEP and RNC officers, of their options and the students were given every opportunity to leave, prior to the RNC taking further action. Those three students were escorted from the building without force or incident. They are each facing a single charge of petty trespassing.

These charges were issued by the RNC. Memorial does not have the authority or ability to drop these charges.

We share your concern about the ongoing violence in Gaza. One of the actions that came about through the advocacy of the protestors was Memorial's commitment to support students displaced by war. This includes working to establish a bursary program to support at-risk students; waiving application fees for Palestinian students—and potentially expanding this initiative to include students from other regions experiencing war—as well as continuing to offer enhanced supports for current Palestinian and Israeli students of Memorial. These enhanced supports include emergency financial assistance, support in seeking informal academic accommodations and access to mental health resources. The university will continue its work towards improved transparency, responsible investing and increased support for students while maintaining a safe environment for all.

Dear Dr. Neil Bose,

Memorial Administration's decision on Friday July 5 to send armed police to remove peaceful protesters was a disgusting act of violence towards its students, and a gross misuse of resources.

We find the excuses offered illegitimate and unacceptable.

-VP Jennifer Lokash cited "a legal obligation to act on orders of a recent fire inspection report". However the report was withheld from students who sought it out on Friday afternoon. When students finally received the report on July 10 the compliance date was revealed to be July 11, 6 days after the police were called.

- Administration claims students had ample warning about the removal yet no date or time was ever indicated. Communications with all relevant offices that day suggested discussions would continue on Monday and even the universities designated student safety liaison admitted he was unaware students would be removed on Friday night until after it had begun. 3 minutes from the time the trespass notice was first read, police were present.

- MUN claims it cares about safety while shutting its Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Anti-racism lead out of conversations before calling in armed police on a group of peaceful protesters including racialized students.

And after all this there has been no proper debriefing with key people involved. As of Wednesday night campus enforcement who had been present on Friday had not been debriefed despite students advocating for this through the union and the liaison for student safety had been provided an inaccurate account of events missing such key information as the fact that students had been arrested and physically removed.

This is unacceptable.

We question the role that student's exposure of potential conflicts of interest and breaches of confidentiality involving the Chair of the Board of Regents played in this decision, and we demand accountability for those involved.

Each of your names will be remembered for the choices you make now.

Will you stand up to this corruption and seek the truth?  
Will you stand up for humanity and speak out against the genocide unfolding in Palestine?  
Will you stand on the right side of history, right the wrongs of MUNs previous stance on apartheid South Africa, and divest now?

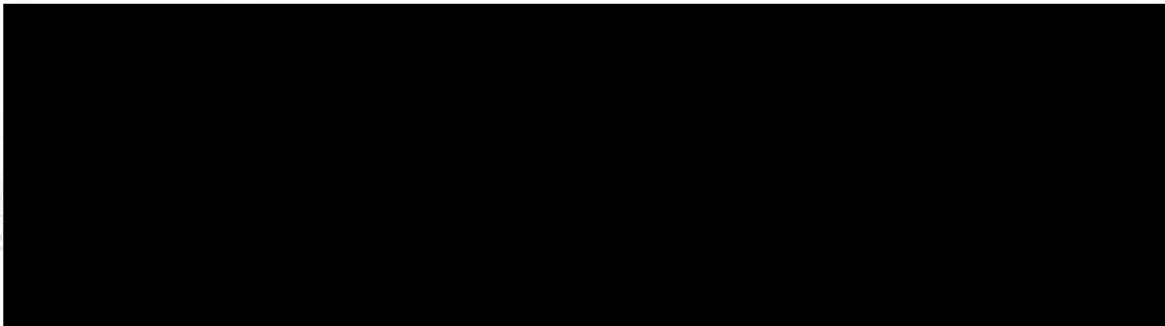

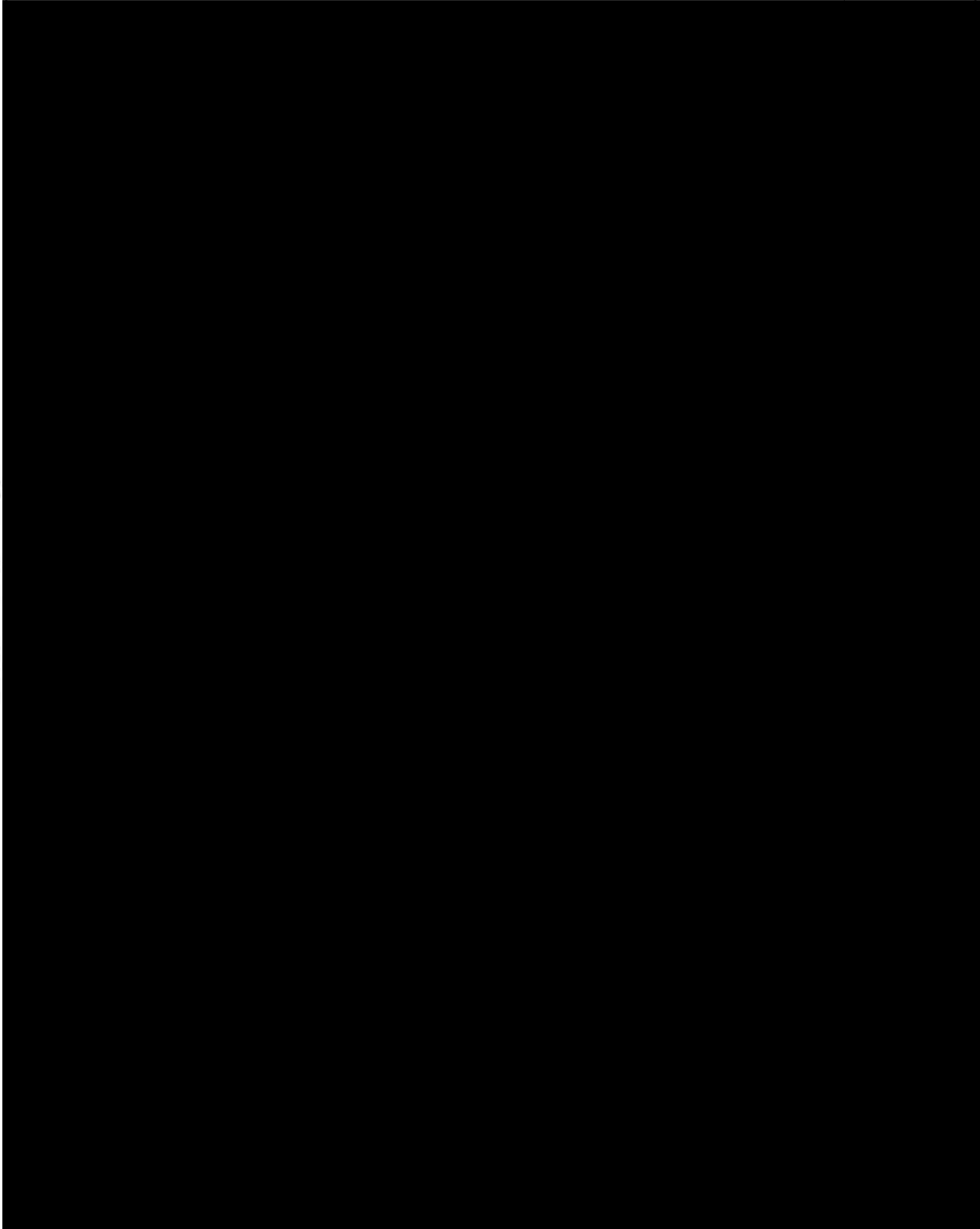

Subject: Re: Follow up on Direction from Board of Regents.

On July 12 the Board of Regents, via Memorial Admin, informed student protesters that the "joint statement must be developed with and endorsed by Memorial's four student unions rather than with an informal collective. To that end, we ask your group to work with the leaders of our student unions to develop a process for moving forward with collaboration on a statement".

Since then Mun Students for Palestine (which includes executives from Munsu and the Canadian Federation of Students as well as student reps from several of the unions) have worked directly with leaders from GSU, MISU and GCSU. Each are CC'd on this email, they have enthusiastically endorsed the students proposed statement (linked below) as it was provided to you June 25. We'll also note that there had been meetings prior between several of these unions and most have released similar statements of their own. The students are united on this concern. Each union has also agreed that, due to limited capacity as well as the urgency of this matter, they would prefer for student representatives from Mun Students for Palestine to continue the negotiation process. We have attached statements to that effect from each union here for your review. Again in light of the urgency of this matter we are eager to meet and pursue next steps at the earliest possible time. Note that as this statement remains unchanged from the one you received June 25 there has been opportunity for your review and consideration.

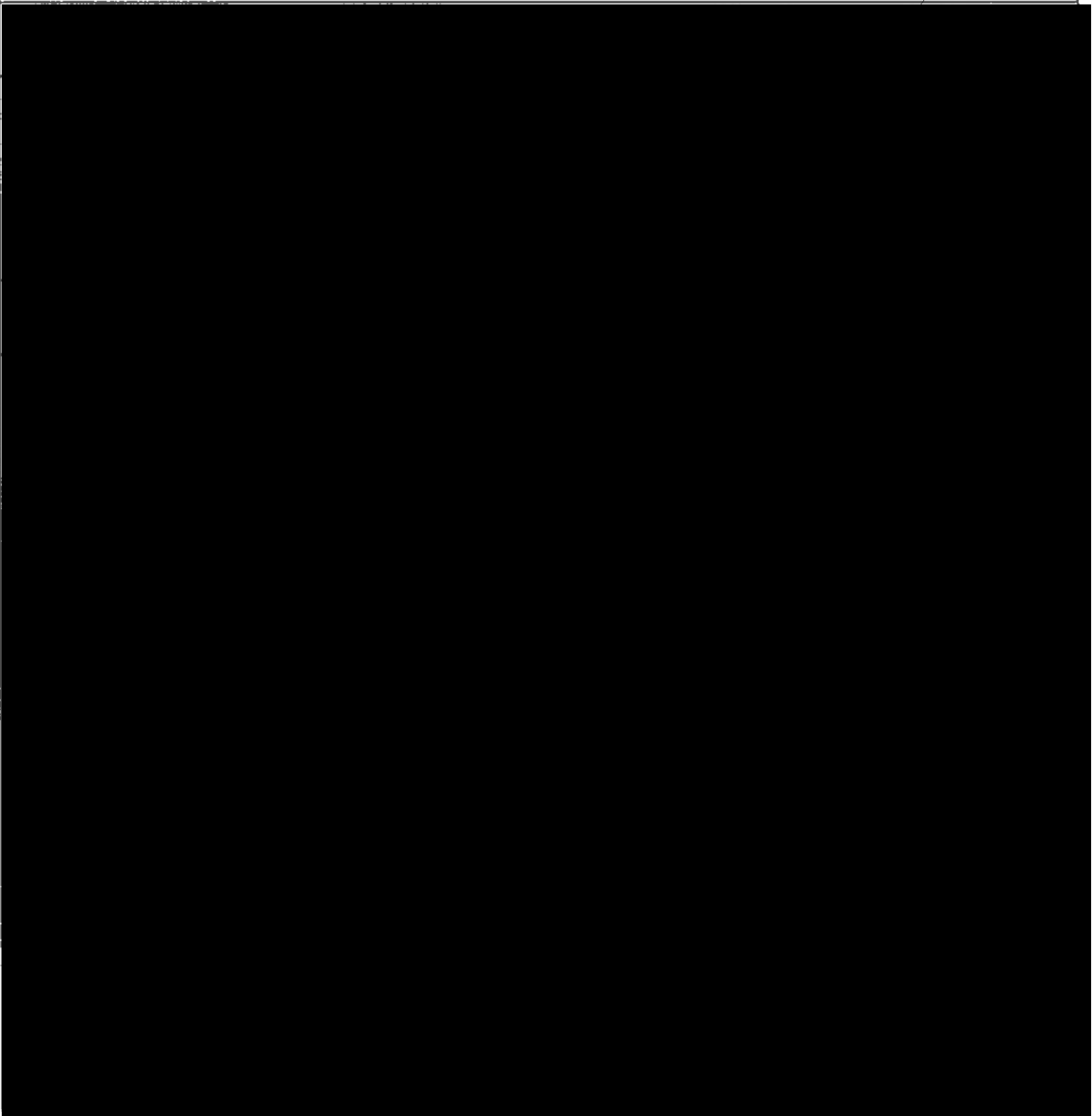
