

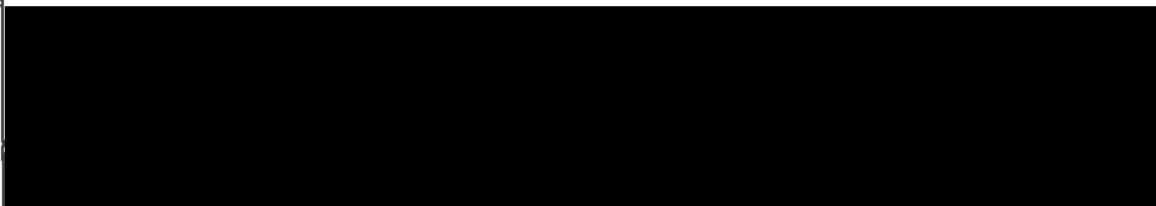

Good evening,

There are some developments to report on regarding the protest.

Yesterday, there were a number of tents brought into the lobby of the Arts and Administration building. [redacted] a request was made to the St. John’s Fire Department for an inspection. They have provided orders, including that the tents are to be removed from the interior and some removed from the exterior, as well as the clean up of the clutter in the lobby in general.

As you are likely aware, on Tuesday, the University of Toronto received an injunction from the Ontario Superior Court against their protesters who had set up an encampment. The protesters were given a deadline to vacate and this occurred without incident. All of the issues raised in this case apply equally to the protesters on the St. John’s campus. [redacted]

Tomorrow, we will be releasing a public statement that calls for an end to the occupation and encampment. The statement outlines our commitment to freedom of expression, academic freedom and the right to protest. It also outlines our commitments, such as providing the board with the documents shared by the students at our June 18 meeting, reviewing the Statements of Investment Policy and Objectives, evaluating investment firms’ commitment to ESG as it relates to investment strategies and support student scholars at risk through a new bursary program.

We will keep you updated on these developments.

## UN Students 4 Palestine call in to discuss "abuses of power" by board of regents

Paddy, from MUN Students 4 Palestine, called in. The conversation begins by mentioning that, of the companies the group is calling on Memorial to divest from, Memorial is invested in 0.297% of them (which Paddy later calls pal... there are 3 companies the group is concerned about, including Motorola, which she argues is contributing to the genocide. She then says the group started a click-to-email-the-board campaign, where students could let the board know they wanted the university to divest from certain companies. She says the board chair forwarded these emails to the parents of students she recognized, amounting to "a huge preach of privacy." Paddy says "fair enough," then changes the conversation to a list of more than 5 things the university has agreed to do, after meeting with the group, and asks why the group doesn't consider this "a pretty significant success." Her response is that the university is "not answering our calls [for action]" and repeating policies they already have in place, which she says are clearly ineffective." *It is worth noting the ESG investment principles she's calling ineffective could be credited to the fact that fewer than 1% of their companies of concern are in the university's investments portfolio.* [Clip 1](#) [p 2](#).

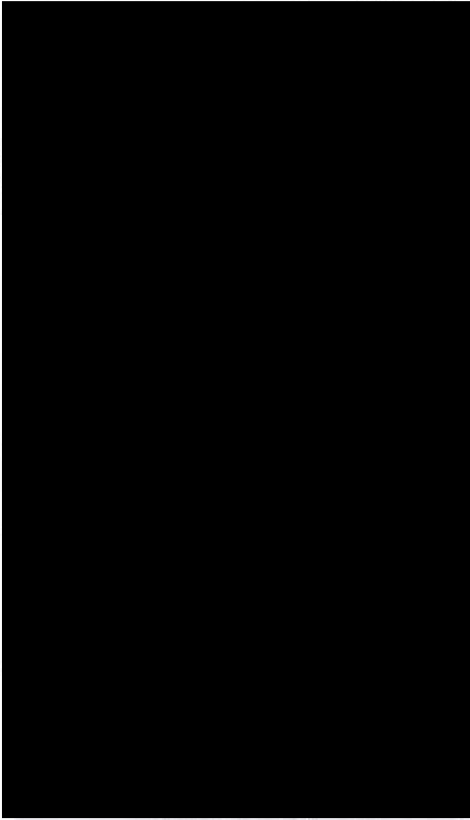

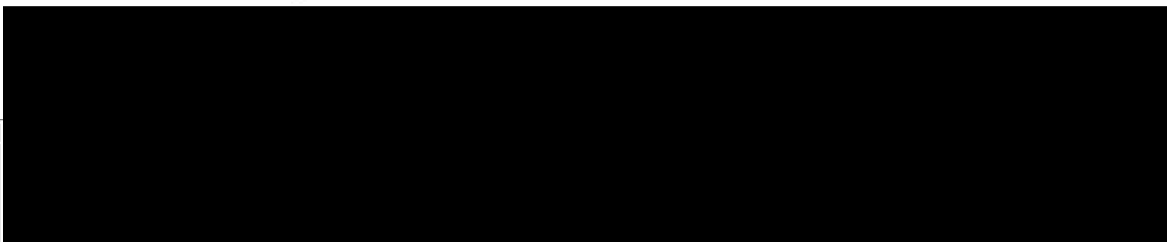

Our university community is made up of all walks of life, and each one of us deserve to feel represented, cared for, and safe. As members of the board of regents, this should mean something to you. The code of conduct should be upheld, and mean something to you. When students are so disturbed and appalled by the actions of the university that they start an encampment, that should mean something to you. The only person, it seems, that could benefit from "growing up" would be Mr. Barnes himself.

The actions of Mr. Barnes are ridiculous, out of line, embarrassing, and should not be tolerated. Clearly, he has shown he is incapable of upholding the code of conduct he agreed to when accepting the position on the board. This is glaringly evident in his recent actions: Breaking confidentiality, being glaringly aggressive and patronizing to the student body who are mobilizing to advocate for a free palestine, which includes our own university divesting. Trying to "retaliate" against grown adults by finding their parents, contacting them, and then continuing to do so after being made aware of how inappropriate it was, is nothing short of unacceptable. Treating well educated grown adults like children, reducing their expert backed (United Nations) stance on a genocide to a child's personal opinion, is shameful.

Let me be clear: Palestine is experiencing a genocide against its people at the hands of Israel. There are no "multiple sides to the story" with "nuanced opinions on each side". This is a genocide. You either are on the right side of history, or you aren't. The University continuing to invest in business/corporations that fund Israel's arms manufacturing is them telling us: we have chosen a side, and it's pro-genocidal. Any well educated person on the issue would agree, and it is evidently clear Mr. Barnes is not that person. His fellow members of the board illustrated the capability to work with students in good faith, listen to their concerns, and take them seriously. If he cannot do the same, and furthermore, cannot follow basic codes of conduct, he has zero place on Memorial University's Board of Regents.

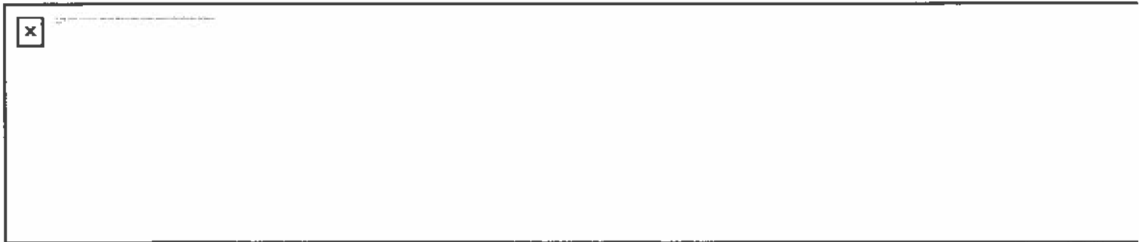
